Book

Green, John. On the Track of the Sasquatch. Agassiz, British Columbia: Cheam

Publishing Ltd, 1969. This book included the most detailed information on the Sasquatch. It talked about different sightings, but it also had facts about the Sasquatch including physical evidence and examples of footprints. I found this resource at the library. Because the source is from 1969, I compared the notes taken from other sources and found that it can be trusted.

Put the author's **last name first.**

"Tells of early days on Sound, F. W. Brown records thrilling experiences in the Northwest." The Tacoma Daily Ledger 15 Oct. 1911: 38. This is a first-person account of a Sasquatch sighting in 1867. Although I can't be sure that Brown is actually telling the truth, the fact that his account is reported in a respected local newspaper is important. I used this source because it was the only first-person account I could find and it was published at a time when the Puget Sound was less populated.
