Sample Bibliography

This is the **format for your heading.**

The **title is centered** and should look like this example, with your topic after the colon.

Bibliography

Put "**quotation marks**" around the **titles of articles.**

NOTE: If a newspaper or magazine is in print or from a database, don't include punctuation after the title.

Put a period at the end of every citation.

Italicize the titles of newspapers, books, magazines, databases and web sites.

Museum

General Web site

Put the author's **last name first.**

Print Newspaper

"Tells of Early Days on Sound, F. W. Brown Records Thrilling Experiences in the Northwest." *The Tacoma Daily Ledger* 15 Oct. 1911: 38. Print.

The word **Web** or **Print** should be included at the end of the citation, before the date visited if it is a Web source.

Book on the Web

Wallas, James. *Kwakiutl Legends*. Blaine: Hancock House, 1911. *Google Book Search*. Google. Web. 25 Nov. 2006.

Indent every line after the first line. This is called a **Hanging Indent**

ABCD... alphabetize your bibliography by the first letter of each citation.

Include a **Date Visited** at the end of the citation for **ALL web resources.**
